

### Vote Close in First Returns

#### Press National Ballots Give Landon Small Lead

First returns from the national political poll conducted by the Argus and other country newspapers in co-operation with the Publishers Auxiliary in Chicago, found 28 states reporting. The poll was conducted in all parts of the United States by newspapers in the smaller cities and towns.

A total of 13,167 votes were counted in this first return with 18 states going for Landon and 10 for Roosevelt. Minor parties and independents polled a small vote.

Like other polls being taken, it favors Landon in the farming belt of the middlewest, with the south democratic, the New England states republican and western states of Oregon and Washington democratic.

The figures show the republicans totaling 6259 votes for president while the democrats are close behind with 6218 for their candidate. The vote on senator and governor show in the totals more votes cast for the democratic column for these offices than in the republican.

### Socialist Nominee to Speak Friday

Norman Thomas, Socialist candidate for president of the United States, will speak at the Portland

auditorium this Friday evening at 8:30 o'clock.

His Portland speech is awaited with special interest because it has been announced he will discuss the Coughlin-Lemke movement, with particular attention to Father Coughlin's warning last week that "bullets rather than ballots" would be decisive in 1940.

Oregon has been selected for this discussion because of the reputed strength of the Townsend movement here, and the support of the Lemke candidacy by certain farm leaders heretofore identified with the progressives.

Mr. Thomas is his party's candidate this year for the third successive time. In 1928 he polled 256,000 votes, but by 1932 the Socialist total was raised to 900,000.

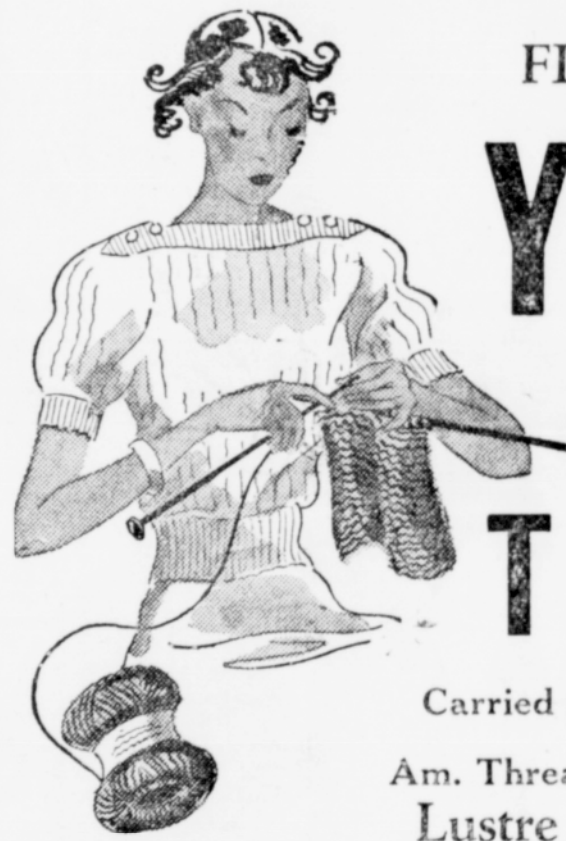

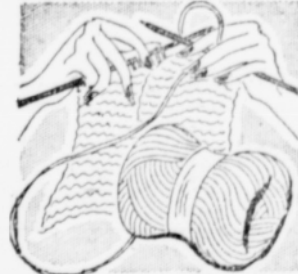
