Birthdays Celebrated A few friends of Mrs. Nels Larsen surprised her with a birthday party Thursday.

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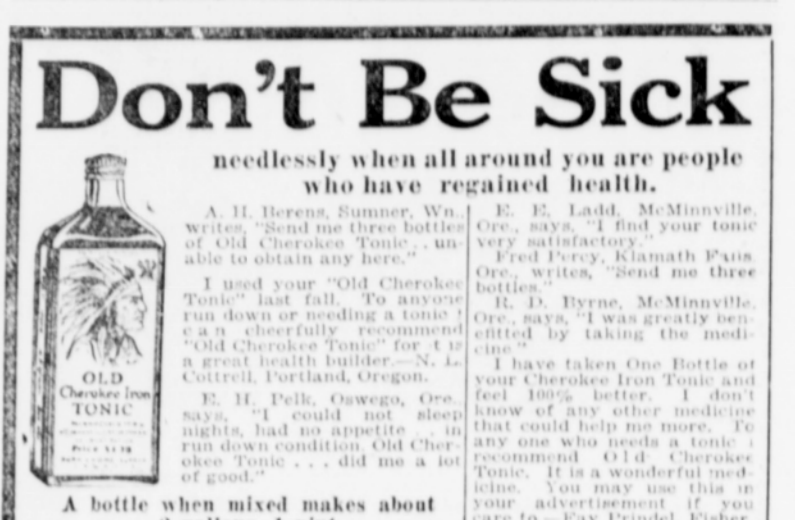
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
