312.68. The city expense was divided to make \$478.20 for general cost. \$1316.78 for sidewalks and concrete and \$257.70 for crushed rock for the roads.

Collections from property owners in the sidewalk project, in which the city furnishes the material and WPA labor costs, while the property owners pay back the cost to the city, has amounted to \$1945.67. A slight and collectible balance still is due the city for this work.

Progress on the sewer lines and disposal plant, as given in the budget report, show the disposal plant completed and the sewer lines 90 percent complete. McGee recommends the completion of an industrial sewer and an additional three miles of a city sewer.
