1937 Budget Estimates, Washington County, Oregon

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 69-1108 of the Oregon Laws of 1930 and to the provisions of Section 69-601 of the Oregon Laws of 1930 as amended by Section 8, Chapter 446 of the 1933 Session Laws of Oregon, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Washington County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court Room in the Washington County Court House in Hillsboro, Oregon, on Saturday, the 28th day of June, 1936, at the hour of ten o'clock A. M. of said day and at the said time and place opportunity will be given to all taxpayers of Washington County to present the estimate of the amount of tax levied and the amount of tax paid by each taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Washington County.

The County Budget Committee for Washington County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for the support of County offices, each County improvement, the maintenance of each County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and reparation in outstanding warrants, the estimate of the receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property in the County during the period for which such tax is to be levied and an estimate of the probable unapportioned and unexpended balances in the funds of the County.
