

Ceresan Found Good for Smut

Barrel Treatment Suggested as Best Method

Ceresan as a treatment for smut in wheat, oats, and barley is particularly superior to wet treatments like blue vitriol and formaldehyde in seasons like the present. Any time grain is treated by dipping or wetting it in a seedling, it is done under conditions such that it will not immediately sprout and begin to grow, there is danger of losing it. Failure to grow may be either dry weather or a wet, cold soil. The tendency to rot is naturally much greater where a wet treatment has been used.

As a control for smut, Ceresan has consistently proven during the past few years more effective than the wet treatments. The effectiveness of the dry dust treatment, however, is dependent upon the thoroughness with which the dust is mixed with the grain. If a considerable quantity of seed grain needs to be treated every year, the grower can probably well afford to build a mixer of his own. Several farmers in the county have done that, taking an old oil drum, putting a crank through it on the diagonal, mounting it on a scaffold high enough so that the grain can be sacked directly from the barrel after it is mixed with the Ceresan by its being revolved. Most of the feed and seed dealers of the county are also prepared to treat this grain before it is sent out.

Some mix it on the barn or granary floor by shoveling it over by hand. That is not as effective a method and is also a disagreeable job owing to the irritating character of the dust when inhaled. Some farmers have followed the practice of putting the grain they want dusted in the drill box, then adding the required amount of dust

and mixing it with their hands. That is the poorest method of all, as too much of grain does not come in contact with the dust by this method.

Another method sometimes used is that of taking a 10-gallon milk can to the field and every time they fill the drill box they treat the grain by putting it into the milk can adding just the amount of Ceresan needed, then tumbling the can around.

Copper carbonate has for a number of years been used as a dust treatment for smut on wheat. Ceresan is beginning to take the place of copper carbonate and if properly used is effective in controlling the smut and eliminates the greater part of the probability of loss through grain rotting that has been with.
