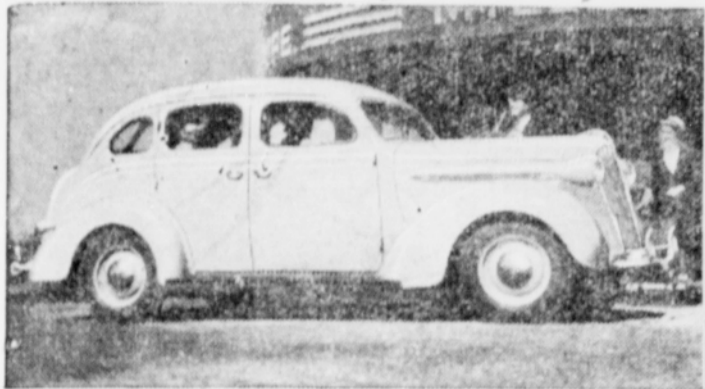


**Dodge, Plymouth Styled in New Lines**



Styled in new lines, both Dodge and Plymouth models, now on display at Cady Motor company in Hillsboro, are attracting considerable interest, says M. P. Cady, manager.

Body style of the new Dodge gives a larger, more roomy interior; large luggage compartment; a new, conveniently controlled and efficient all-weather ventilating system, and many other refinements.

Riding comfort has been greatly improved through chair high seats, new airplane type shock absorbers, and improved ride levelator. And to top all these improvements, the new Dodge safety all-steel body now is securely mounted on cushions of rubber that banish road noises from the body.

Greater safety to passengers is offered in the all steel body with a gracefully moulded, all-steel top, forming an impregnable unit of steel surrounding the passengers in case of accident.

Another safety factor stressed this year by Dodge is the improved, genuine hydraulic brakes, which, with a light pressure of the foot, brings the car to a smooth, sure stop, either in the emergency which comes at least once to all drivers, or in general operation of the car.

The famous Dodge "L" head engine, with improvements, again will be the source of power insuring even greater economy this year. Some of the new features are full length water jacket insuring greater cooling capacity; automatic vacuum spark control; high compression motor head; valve seat inserts; aluminum pistons, and improved oil filter.

Generator equipment, always a trouble source on motor cars, has been remodeled to give air cooling and automatic voltage control, insuring a maximum of efficiency at all times without overloading the electrical system.

Another new feature this year is the silent hypoid rear axle, insuring silent action at all times. In the new Dodge all transmission gears now operate on ball or roller bearings to produce more quiet operation.

Many of the new features of Dodge will be found on the new and luxurious Plymouth, which is

declared to be the best value yet offered in the low priced field.

Examination discloses such features as floating power; hydraulic brakes; all safety steel body; balanced springing; aero-hydraulic shock absorbers, and new hypoid rear axle.

Inside, more room has been added with the new sound deadening insulation to prevent road noise. Plymouth, too, has the new ventilating windshield.

**Portlander Talks Townsend Meet**

Clarence R. Wagoner, insurance man of Portland, addressed the local Townsend club gathering Sunday in the Methodist church. Mr. Wagoner is a man of wide experience in national affairs, and he not only gives his time as an official speaker for the movement, but sponsors a daily radio broadcast "Voice of American Womanhood" over KWJJ station.

Wagoner in his address characterized the Townsend movement as the greatest moulder of public opinion on national affairs that has ever come to this country. He declared nothing but good can come to a nation from a movement that invokes the blessing of God and salutes the American flag at every meeting. Through the Townsend movement has been created the most powerful forum, open to the private citizen, on all public questions and issues, he pointed out. The sweeping victory of the Townsend candidates in the recent election is evidence that the movement has awakened the voter to a realization that his priceless privilege is the ballot. At last report, he said, 111 Townsend candidates had been elected to congress; the Townsend clubs of Oregon had elected all three representatives to congress, and seventy-five per cent of the state legislature.

The next big move of the movement is to enroll 15,000,000 names on a petition to congress with 25,000 from each congressional district asking congress for a hearing of the Townsend plan on the floor of congress. Every Townsend club

member is asked to cooperate in this great undertaking in the next few weeks.

Next meeting of the club will be at the Baptist church November 29.

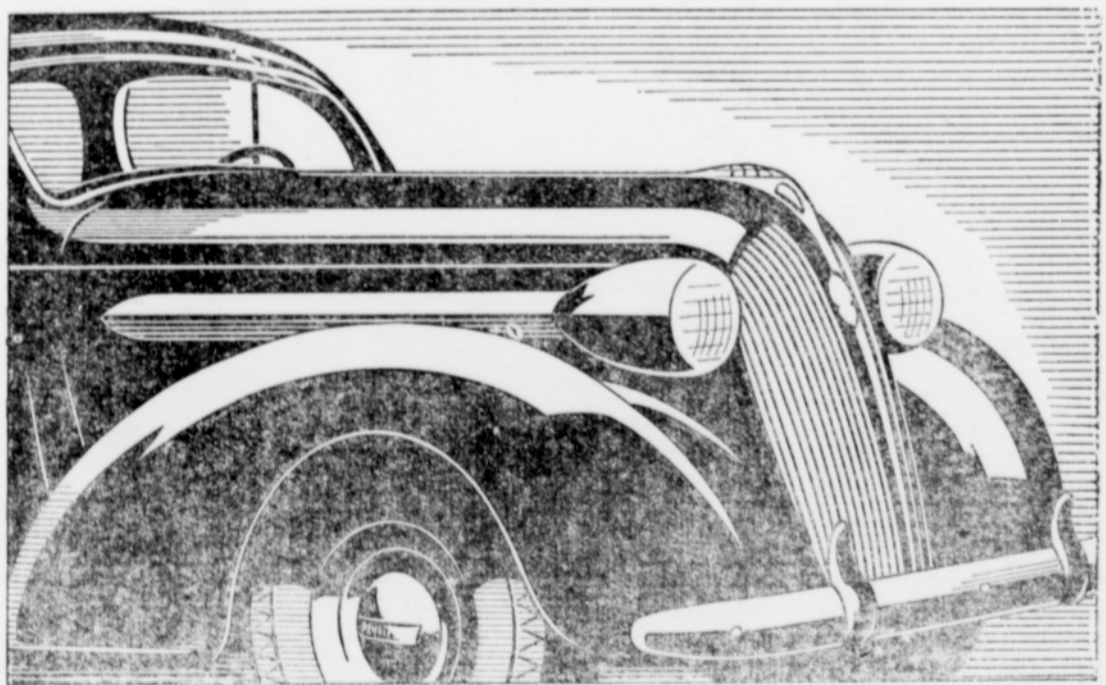
