Local Winery Sales Increase

With an increase in trade extending over a considerable territory by the Tualatin Valley Winery, formerly owned by Louis Herbold and sold last summer to Lee Bettenger of California, local wines seem to be finding a ready market.

Associated with him in the manufacturing end is H. E. Bettenger. The new proprietors are modernizing the winery as rapidly as possible, moving the barreled wines into newly installed vats for aging, and bottling the remainder for sale to a growing list of retailers.

One of the first installations includes a special filter arrangement through which the wine passes three times, removing all sediment and creating a clear, well

flavored product by the time it reaches the bottle. In the bottling room, the wine is placed in pints, quarts, gallons and half gallon containers and all labeled with the local winery label showing the kind. At present the winery is producing two sweet wines, the Sweet Tualatin, which is a red wine and the Golden Tualatin, which is white. In addition there are three kinds of dry wines, Claret, Zinfandel and Burgundy.

The Bettengers have been connected with the wine industry in California. Lee Bettenger will remain in Hillsboro during the winter months, returning to California in the summer, while H. E. Bettenger has become a resident of Hillsboro.

A. M. Scott is handling the merchandising and sales over the state while Herb Kappel of Forest Grove is sales representative in the local territory.
