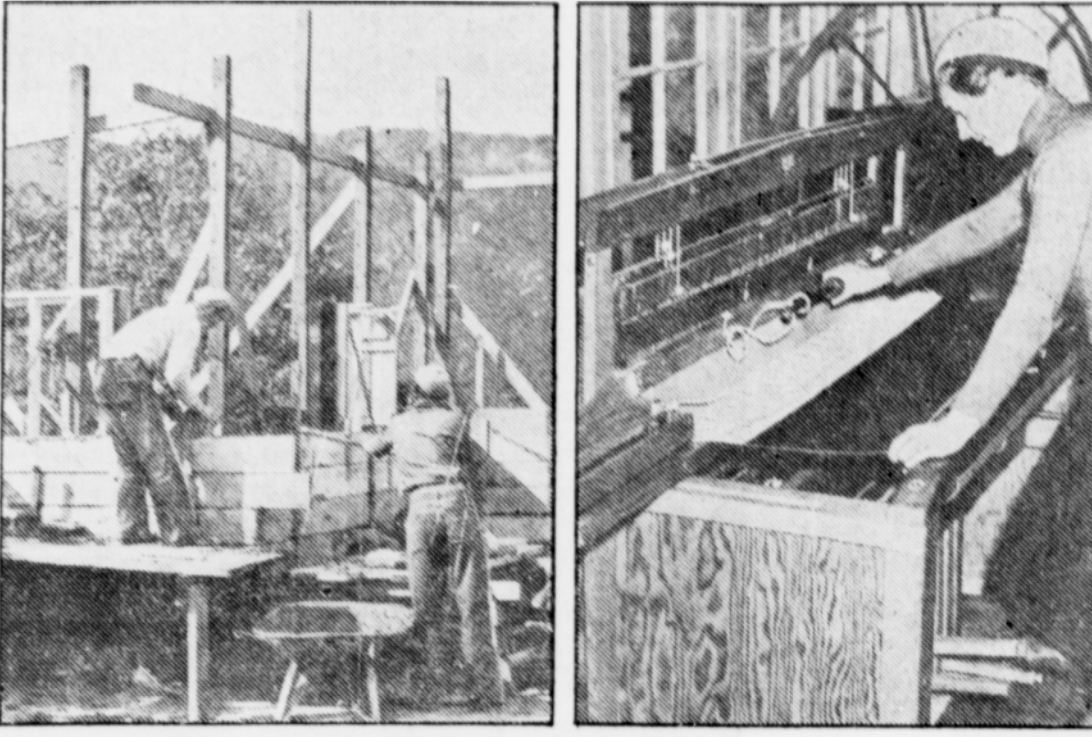
**Birthday Celebrated**
