Canning and food preservation carried on by the homemakers in the 78 Washington county families under the resettlement administra-tion rehabilitation program, will insure ample food and balanced menus for the winter months, states Mrs. Christine Hawver, home management supervisor. Hillsboro.

Reports from 45 of these families show over 17,500 quarts of fruit, vegetables and meats, representing \$3928 worth of food at present prices, were canned this summer, not including vegetables dried and stored or meat in refrigeration. As food canned and stored is com-parable to money in the bank, it is reported in dollars and cents so the homemaker can credit her-self with earning a definite part of the family income, Mrs. Hawver

Revised home plans for the com ing year are being prepared for all the families with the past year's records as a basis for more ade-quate budgets. Increased home prohabilitation families an ample food supply for the winter as well as making more of the cash income available for payments on their loans, taxes and other cash expen-

Families under this program have the assistance of the home supervisors in planning budgets, in food preservation work, clothing needs, purchasing of household equipment, and other household problems. Home economics workers of the extension service are also co-oper ating and anxious to assist through bulletins, or personal contact, with any problems confronting the homemakers of the rehabilitation




