national traveler, discussed world affairs at the luncheon meeting Thursday noon.

Stone pointed to the cleavage between the world powers, four of whom are satisfied with conditions at present and three are dissatisfied. Powers satisfied with the present alignment are the U. S., Germany, Italy and Japan are on Britain, France and Russia, while the other side. All want peace, but all are arming to the limit. These major powers control the destinies of the world. Germany, he said, is the keystone of the arch and when Germany moves "the fat is in the fire." Stone declared that a war of tariffs led to the depression.

There is also a cleavage in the philosophy of living, communism with the group being the principal thing, fascism with the dictatorship of the state and democracy stressing the supreme worth of the individual. All are coming to grips in an intense struggle.

Edward's Abdication Ushers Quiet George Into Kingship



Suddenly made ruler of the greatest of world empires Britain's new king personifies the traditional family man of British life. Here is a recent picture of the new monarch with his wife and two daughters, Princess Elizabeth, left, now their presumptive to the throne, and Margaret Rose.

ABDICATION of the British throne by Edward VIII for the love of the American divorcee, Mrs. Wallis Warfield Simpson, brings to the rulership a new king, George VI, strikingly reminiscent of the late George V.

For Albert Frederick Arthur George, former Duke of York, is practically the antithesis of his older brother. While Edward chose globe trotting, Albert spent his youth in the navy, married, and has two charming daughters, Edward loved sports, dancing, and the gayer side of life. The new monarch has preferred the seclusion of his study. Edward was essentially a cosmopolitan. Albert's interests have been more confined. He has taken an especial interest in industrial matters.

The second son and second child of the late King George V and Queen Mary, Albert was born Dec. 14, 1895, at York Cottage, Sandringham. He and the Prince of Wales, only a year and a half older, were playmates, had the same tutors. Later the two went through military work together.

At the age of 14 Albert entered the Royal Naval college at his father's behest. A year later he was sent on an extensive cruise. He came back a midshipman. And in those days he fared hard and share alike with his mates.

Came the great war and Albert was serving as a young officer on a war vessel. Eventually he battled with his men in one of the greatest and fiercest of all the war's naval engagements—the battle of Jutland. He emerged a hero.

Then illness struck him. Upon recovery it was thought best that he forsake the sea. That was in 1917. So the young prince became an air pilot, serving in France. Since the war he has maintained a constant interest in aviation and naval matters. Like Edward, in one respect, Albert has also exhibited keen interest in the welfare problems of the working classes.

In 1923 Prince Albert wed Lady Elizabeth Bowes-Lyon, a commoner in the parlance of royalty, and the marriage won the blessings of the king and queen. There is a story that

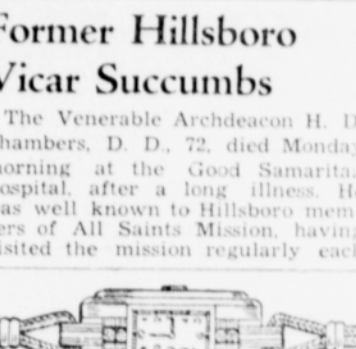
