Mrs. Boyd Wright, Walter and Bettye Jean were visitors in Portland Friday and Saturday.

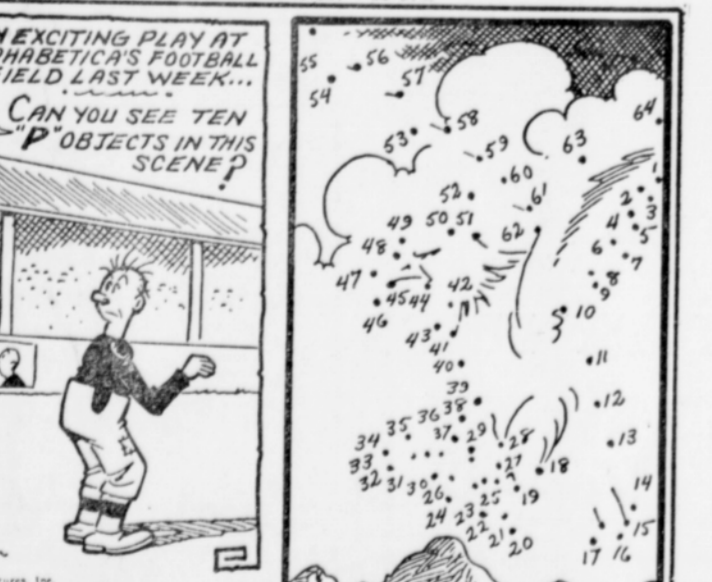
Ray Elliott was in Good Samaritan hospital for medical treatment from Tuesday until Saturday.

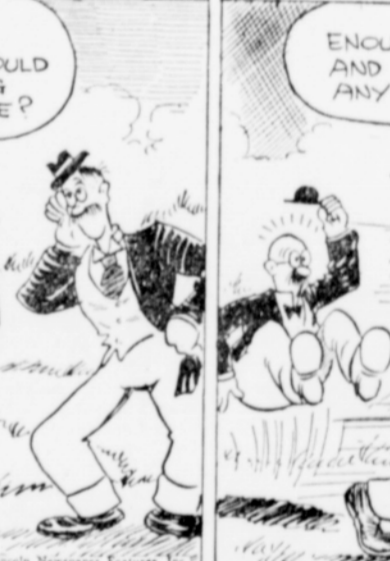

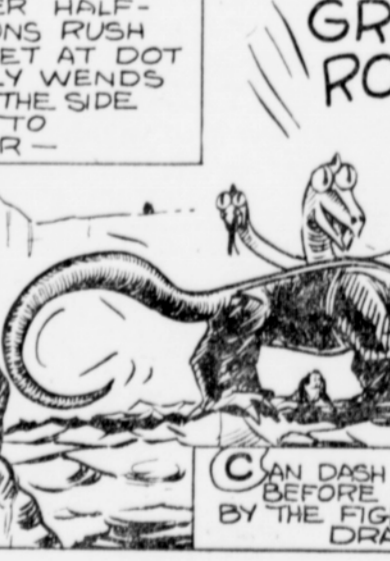
