C. W. Brown and his grandson Dickie of Portland were week-end guests of his daughter, Mrs. S. J. Bechen.

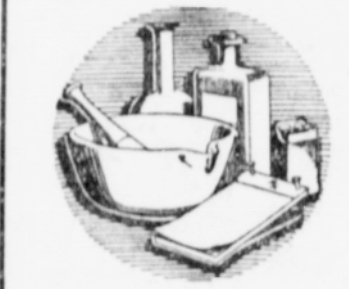
Tom Ruthrauff of Seaside returned home Saturday after a two months' visit with his sister, Mrs. Frank Baker, and family.

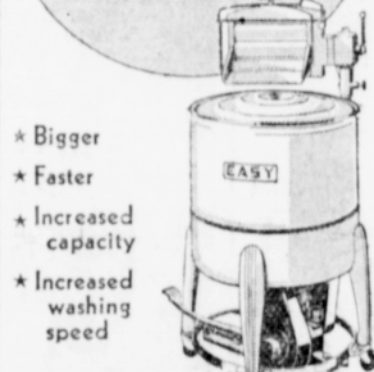
