Washington county poultrymen will meet at the Tigar Grange hall Tuesday at 8 p. m., reports L. E. Francis, assistant county agent.

G. C. Keeney, manager of the Pacific Poultry Producers' Co-operative association, will be the speaker. Subject of his discussion will be "The Egg Market Situation, Its Present Problems, and Future Outlook."

The midwestern drought of the past season has changed the picture of the egg situation in the country, just as it has many other agricultural commodities, states Francis, and a review of this situation, accompanied by a discussion of the outlook for the coming year, should be of value and interest to the poultrymen. Keeney is in a particularly fine position to discuss this problem because of the competent and reliable eastern contacts which his association keeps.

Following the regular meeting, the Washington County Poultry Council will hold a special meeting at which time they will outline to the poultrymen their activities during the past two months and will also discuss some important items in state legislature which directly affects the poultrymen.
