been definitely turned down on the movement.

Many Reasons
There are many reasons why there should be a larger distribution of gas tax money to the municipalities. McGee says in a prepared article for publication released by the League of Oregon Cities.

Leading the long list of reasons for a more even split in this fund, McGee cites two facts. First he cites the condition of streets, which he declares is deplorable in many instances, brought to this condition by lack of revenue with which to make necessary repairs. Property abutting the streets to be improved or repaired, he points out, no longer can bear the burden of taxation necessary to the needs.

Second reason, as outlined by McGee, is the fact that 61.6 per cent of the population of the state resides within corporate limits, and 34.4 per cent in the rural areas, thus making at least two-thirds of the highway revenue originate within the cities of Oregon.

City Travel Heavy
McGee, in his argument, also recites that from 20 to 35 per cent of the travel in city dwellers in the smaller cities, and from 60 to 70 per cent of the travel of Portland motorists, is on city streets.

Large amounts also are paid in bus fares, delivery trucks, and other vehicles, which never get on the highways. Cities also, at present, pay the gasoline tax on

fuel used by police cars, fire trucks and street cleaning equipment, none of which ever use highways maintained outside the city limits. Twelve states of the union now share gasoline tax revenue with the cities, including California and Washington, while nine share motor vehicle license revenues.

On Personal Rolls
In 31 states, the motor vehicle is assessed and placed on the personal property tax rolls, thus furnishing a source of revenue to the cities on all such vehicles maintained inside the city limits, he points out.

Closing his argument, McGee points out that revenues from the gasoline tax have increased to such an extent that a small sum may now be distributed to cities without retarding the general development of roads and highways. Increase in gas tax revenues increased nearly \$1,500,000 during the last year over 1935, while the increase in revenue from license and motor transportation fees bring the net increase to a much larger amount, McGee points out.
