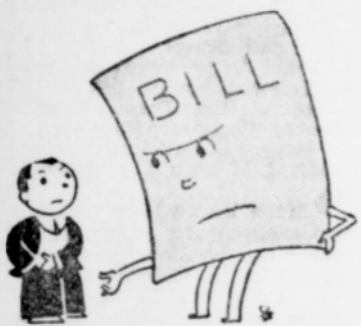
**High Award**

Thursday, January 21  
R. E. Wilcox, Portland civic leader, dies.

Roosevelt urges continuance of authority to make reciprocal trade treaties, saying it has been aid to peace.

Thousands of families driven from Ohio river at Cincinnati. Secretary of Labor Perkins says principal barrier to resumption of peace negotiations in General Motors' strike was continued occupation of General Motors plants by sit-down workers.

Friday, January 22  
Labor disputants in General Motors strike disregard advice of Roosevelt against publicity.
