

Pacific to Play Mt. Angel Here; Hilhi in Fray

Local fans will be given a choice of basketball Saturday night when the high school sponsors a doubleheader feature program featuring a college club between the Pacific and Mt. Angel college teams. In the preliminary contest starting at 7:30 the local high school five will take the floor against the Pacific Fresh team.

Pete Miller's Badgers jumped into the limelight last week when they defeated the highly touted College of Puget Sound five, which had defeated University of Washington and were being touted as conference favorites. The Badgers have two veterans in Sikstrom, forward, and Elbertson, center, while the rest of the squad is made up of new and inexperienced men, many of whom are freshmen. Selfridge, local Hillsboro boy and a

freshman at Pacific, is slated to start at a guard position. Slyter, another freshman who hails from Molalla, will start at the other guard position, while Seem, high scoring freshman forward, will get the call at the other forward berth. Vernon Cook, sophomore forward, who is also a Hillsboro boy, is due to see action in the game even though not slated to start.

The Mt. Angel college team has shown great strength in downing several outstanding clubs, foremost among their victories was that over the strong Southern Oregon Normal team. One of the mainstays of their team is Elwood Moore, all-state star from Tillamook.

In the preliminary clash, Coach Pete Miller will start David Petrasoff of Estacada, Bob Clain of Colton, George Racette of Woodburn, LaVerne Dahl of Molalla and Melvin Alter of Lewistown, Mont. against the Hillsboro high school five.

Local League Basketball Team in Lead

Hillsboro, outstanding among the county basketball league teams for points scored, also is leading the league with Tigard next. Thursday Hillsboro played two games under handicap, traveling to Cornelius to win there 60-11 and returning to meet Beaverton and administer a defeat 39-27.

The league is in full swing and all teams are showing a little better form. Several reverses have been made in supposedly strong teams. Tigard was held to a low margin by Cornelius and Tualatin, Tualatin upset the strong Oreno quarter by a large score on Tuesday. The team is Elwood Moore, all-state star from Tillamook.

So far the teams showing enough class to land in the three top positions and playoff for the title are Oreno, Tigard, Tualatin and Hillsboro. Hillsboro has scored 219 points to 63 against them. Tigard, next best to the Hillsboro record, shows 115 points scored as compared to 72 scored against them.

The remainder of the league schedule is expected to drop a few of the top teams out of the top positions. Monday Hillsboro meets Tualatin there and Tuesday will meet Cornelius here. Beaverton plays Oreno and Tigard at Banks. Wednesday the locals will be at Beaverton and Friday at Tigard.

So far the locals have been handicapped by sickness among the players. Recently Ham Chiotti has been added and indications are that the lineup will soon be strengthened. Wahner and Peterson have been showing well on offense and Shad-duck has proved a stonewall on defense.

The Hillsboro team added its fifth win Tuesday night, defeating Oreno in the last 45 seconds of play. The score at half was 16 all and at the end of the third quarter 28-24 for Oreno. With four minutes left to play, the going got hot and several fights enlivened the game with several players ejected from the game. With two-and-one-half minutes left to play, Oreno leading by one point, Wakagama for Hillsboro sank a field goal to win.

Hilhi lagged behind in the first half, scoring three times from the field and missing all free shots while Beaverton sank four from the field and three free throws to make the score 11-6 at the half.

G. M. Leslie, member of the Washington County Poultry council, presided. Twenty-five poultrymen attended the meeting.
