Can Be Regulated

Appearing recently before the city council in Hillsboro, a representative of the Northwest Amusement company of Portland, in requesting that the machines be licensed in Hillsboro, pointed out that they could be regulated to allow a smaller or greater percentage of return to the person playing them. This fact is said to explain why some machines seldom return anything to the player.

State-wide drive against them followed almost immediately after a decision rendered by Judge Crawford of the Multnomah county circuit court, who ruled them gambling devices with the element of chance predominating.
