Hillsboro independent basketball team now leads the Washington County league. Hillsboro pulled the unexpected Friday night at Tigard by winning easily from that team. At the end of the first quarter the Hillsboro girls led 21-8. At the end of the half they still kept a fifteen point lead. But the pace they set soon told on them when their heavier opponents started to play a rough, rushing game. Hillsboro finally drawing up to the end with a 31 to 24 win.

Wahner led the attack with 14 points. Shadwick and Chiotti playing their best game of the season on defense. Ross Cox returned on time to help in win over Tigard by making 6 points on sensational shots at the most critical time of the game.

The league standing now holds Hillsboro at the top with six wins out of six. Orenco and Tigard are tied for second place with five wins and two losses each. Cornelius and Tualatin are next in the column with Banks each holding one win and four losses. Beaverton holds down the cellar position with five lost.


