WASHINGTON LETTER BY SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT

WASHINGTON.—When the President, Harry Hopkins, and the Budget Bureau agree on recommendations, Congress will be asked to appropriate between one and two billion dollars for relief expenditures in the next fiscal year.

There is no promise that Roosevelt can work out a permanent unemployment relief program. The plan at this point is to cut the rolls down to 1,600,000 heads of families and single persons by June 30, the end of the fiscal year.

TO keep within their quotas for the remainder of this fiscal year, state administrators will, altogether, have to drop 50,000 employes in March, 150,000 in April, 200,000 in May, and 200,000 more in June.
