 Miss Ruth Liebenow has resigned her position in Portland. She intends to spend the summer at home.


Make Poppy Posters

Hill School Has Ups and Downs; Finally Closed

From 1905 until 1930 when the new four-story, fire-proof building was erected on the present site, the old building demolished, and the new establishment changed in name from St. Mary's Institute to St. Mary's of the Valley.
 The new home provides quarters for nuns in retirement, class rooms for novitiates, and a boarding school for lay girls. The membership of the community now is 200.
 Last autumn, a \$30,000 chapel on the south side of the main building was completed and dedicated.
 Following are the schools conducted by the Sisters and the date of establishment:
 Sublimity, 1888; Verboort, 1891; St. Mary's home, 1891; St. Mary's boarding and day school, 1902; Sacred Heart, Tillamook, 1903; Sacred Heart, Gervais, 1908; St. Stephens, Portland, 1909; Holy Cross, Portland, 1912; St. Francis, Roy, 1912; St. Cecilia, Beaverton, 1913; St. Mattheus, Hillsboro, 1914; St. Agathas, Portland, 1915; St. Johns, Milwaukie, 1919; St. Andrews, Portland, 1921; Our Lady of Sorrows, Portland, 1926; St. Mary's, Stayton, 1932. Present registration totals 22,223 pupils.




