**Need Protection**

Trees, shrubs and flowers listed for protection include Calypso bulbosa, Fritillarias, Erythroniums, Trilliums, Wild Lilies, Iris Tenius, Iris inominata, Iris gormanii, Cypripedium montanum, Pitcher plant, Maiden Hair fern, Rhododendrons, Azaleas, Kalmiopis, Lady Slipper, Ceanothus prostratus, Campanula piperi, Lewisia tweedyi, Gentians.

Among the trees are Port Orford cedar, Oregon Myrtle, all young trees, Pacific Dogwood, Chinquapin and all trees along the roadsides. When leaf, stem and flower of a bulbous plant are destroyed during the blooming season, the life of the bulb will be greatly weakened and the plant rarely recovers, it is pointed out.
