For the past several years Stillwell has been an executive with social agencies and public employment services in the Pacific coast. He is a member of Hillsboro Post No. 6, The American Legion.


Mac Hoke of Pendleton, state president of the Farm Bureau, pointed out that the organization was ally of all other farm groups and not competing body. Influence of the Farm Bureau was rated as the highest in the national capital. The organization, he said, represents 450,000 of the leading and thinking farmers of the nation and is the sponsor of the 1937 agricultural adjustment act.

Great possibilities for the organization in Oregon were seen by Hoke, who said the group was not going to ask for a state bank or the strict use of Bonneville power for the farms, but rather that encouragement of its use by industry would benefit all.

## Month Closes with Moisture Need on Farms

With only .82 inches of rainfall recorded for May, the month closed crops in need of moisture and prone to drought at hand. This will add to the shortage of hay and may cut the grain yields unless rains arrive early this month.

Temperatures, however, have been with the highest recorded Monday when the mercury climbed to 85 degrees. Last year the highest temperature for the month was May 25 when the thermometer registered 93 degrees. There were seven days May a year ago when the mercury was at 85 degrees or higher.

Lowest temperature for the month this year was May 4, when the mercury dropped to 32 degrees during the night. May 5, 1936, was the coldest for the month in that year with 34 degrees recorded.

Rainfall for May, 1936, amounted to 3.63 inches, making the month just closed 2.81 inches short. Rainfall, nearly three inches short of normal at the beginning of the month, now is more than 5 inches behind.

The month has been marked by considerable cloudy weather, with light rains scattered over the period, but not enough moisture falling at any one time to wet the ground to any depth.
