Lindow Herd Cow Wins High Honors

Lone Fir Inka Ruby, a junior three-year-old cow, owned by J. A. Lindow & Sons of Portland, is the only purebred Holstein from Oregon to receive honor list recognition in 1936. There were 32 junior three-year-olds competing for high honors in the 100 months division, class B and "Ruby" ranked seventh with her record of 552 pounds fat and 16,834 pounds milk.
