The papers mention the town of Columbia in Tualatin county as the center of legal records.

Hillsboro was established by David Hill, who named it Columbia, and later in Hill's honor, the name was changed to Hillsboro.

William Johnson is the man credited with constructing the first house in Portland and with starting the first store, Wilkes relates.
