Harrison Family to Have Reunion Here June 27th

Descendants of John Harrison, Washington county pioneer of 1846, will meet for a picnic gathering in Shute park on Sunday, June 27. Several members of the family from the east and others from southern Oregon and Washington are expected to be present.

John Harrison and his wife, Mary Smith Harrison, came to Washington county in 1846 from Birmingham, Iowa. He hauled mill stones overland and across the Cascades by the Barlow road and established near Mountaineer one of the earliest flour mills in Oregon territory. The first surveyed road in Washington county was laid out from Hillsboro to Harrison's mill. Flour from the mill was hauled over the Cornelius Pass road and shipped to sea-going ships. During the California gold rush pack trains of burros hauled flour overland to the gold fields from the mill.
