By excavating said street to the proper street grade in relation to the presently constructed concrete walks; construct concrete curbs along properties, including curbs in intersections; pave between curbs, for a width of thirty-six (36) feet with hot plant mix bituminous concrete pavement consisting of a two (2) inch wearing surface on a four (4) inch crushed rock base, including variable width pavement in intersections; provide paved private driveways of bituminous or Portland cement concrete; provide for proper drainage and do such other work as will make a workmanlike improvement.


