

County Legion Junior Baseball Team in District Play-Off at Dallas Friday

Friday at Dallas in the first game of the district play-offs, according to a schedule arranged at Salem Wednesday night by representatives of the various teams. Hillsboro was represented by Carl Russell, Dr. Ralph Dresser and S. E. Fayram.

Telleck attempted another bunt, which failed, and then Taylor, first baseman, hit a two-bagger to win the game.
