S. H. Pomeroy spent the week-end with his sister, Mrs. Robinson, of Eugene.

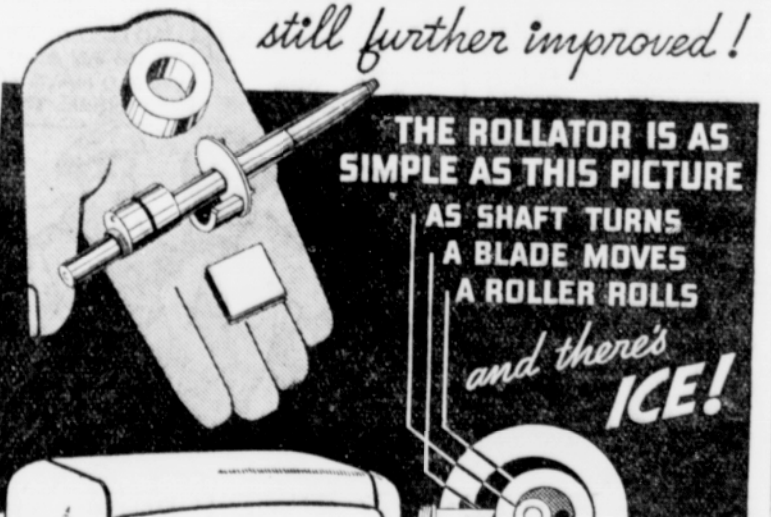

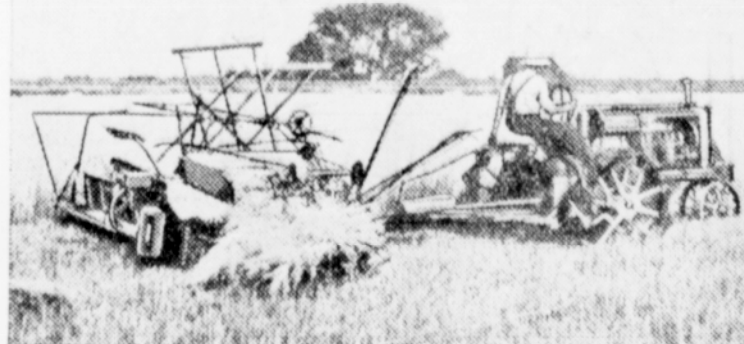
