

Playground Members To Picnic August 5

Next Thursday, August 5, playground members will meet for a noon picnic in Shute park. Committees are being selected to take care of plans and invitations will be issued to all who have taken part in playground activities this season.

Tentative plans include: At 11 a. m., leave Junior high; 11:15, leave David Hill school; 12:30, picnic lunch at park; 1:30, home talent program, Joyce Kellington and Evelyn Patton in charge. Each boy and girl will be given an opportunity to put on a short skit, act, tumbling stunt, song or dance, and the best numbers will be chosen. The name and nature of each act should be given to the committee before Thursday. At 2:30 there will be a softball game; croquet contest (under 10 years); 3:30, croquet contest (over 10 years).

At this time the awards will be made to those who have been regular in attendance and have completed a number of the playground projects.

Climaxing one phase of the summer playground classes will be a doll-dressing contest conducted by Mrs. Becker, who has charge of the craft classes. Tuesday and Thursday at Junior high. Each girl interested may report this Thursday, although the main work will begin next Thursday. Any size or type of doll may be entered as long as it is dressed in an outfit made by the girl entering the doll. Quantities of small materials and laces have been donated by the department stores and may be used by the young seamstresses for finisings and extras.

Judges will be selected to choose the best dressed dolls, and prizes will be awarded.

With exception of the swimming classes and Mrs. Becker's craft classes the playground work will end August 5.

The swimming classes, which are drawing large numbers, will continue until August 11.
