Those who contributed from Forest Grove were Carnation Lumber Co., Findall Hardware Co., and McCready Lumber Co.

The building work was done by men from Hillsboro and Forest Grove who donated their services. The Washington county council wishes to thank all who helped in any way.

Trained counselors are being provided for Camp Adahi by the Portland council of Camp Fire Girls.

Miss Billie Richards, who has been a counselor at Namanu for many years, will be camp director.

Miss Helen Asahri will teach handcraft. The names of the swimming and campcraft counselors are

not known as yet, but there will be one for each group.

Mrs. Gilbert will be the camp cook and the Washington county public health nurse will have charge of the children's health while they are in camp. Each girl is required to have a health examination not earlier than five days before going to camp.

The cost to each girl for the five days at camp including craft materials will be \$3.50.

A new Camp Fire group is being formed in Hillsboro with Mrs. Russell Tidale as guardian.

Next meeting of the Washington county council will be held with the Camp Fire guardians at Adahi August 11.
