

Service Planned as Memorial to Bombing Victim

Echoes of the undeclared Chinese-Japanese war, which led to the bombing of Shanghai over the week-end, will be heard in Hillsboro next Sunday morning with the holding of a memorial service for one of the African victims of the air attack, at the chapel worship at Pilgrim House. Pastor Henry S. Haller will preach on the topic "The Crown of the Martyrs," and the life of Dr. Frank Joseph Rawlinson, who was killed in Shanghai on Saturday, will be reviewed. The missionary to China was a correspondent of Pastor Haller's. Chapel service is at 9:30 a. m.

Dr. Rawlinson was born in Rutlandshire, England, and was brought up in the Baptist church, attending Bucknell university when he came to America, and receiving his clerical training at Rochester seminary, both Baptist institutions. He first went to China under a commission from the Southern Baptist convention, but on a furlough to this country in 1924 he transferred to the American Board of Commissioners of Foreign Missions, the agent of the Congregational churches. He received his master's degree from Columbia university, and his doctorate from his alma mater, Bucknell. As editor of the "Chinese Recorder," author, and counsellor of younger clergy, Dr. Rawlinson was one of the best known and liked members of the missionary clergy in China.
