

County Agent Gathers Data on Corn Seed

Field corn growing in Washington county is being considered from the standpoint of a major grain crop for small farms, reports L. E. Francis, assistant county agent, and surveys are being conducted in an effort to determine the cost of production, yield, and cash return per acre.

It has been recognized for some time that the raising of small grains has not been a satisfactory enterprise for smaller farms because the return per acre has not been adequate to provide sufficient income. With the rather rapid growth, and the development of field corn raising in the county, has come the possibility that this crop will provide an adequate income for these smaller farms, states Francis.

Trials in which the yields of various strains of hybrid field corn from the middle west are being compared with the locally grown corn, are being conducted along with the survey on cost of production. This work was started this year and definite data is not yet available.

Four-H club members enrolled in the Commercial National Bank of Hillsboro corn growing contest, are playing a vital part in the development of the local field corn enterprise.

The next few years should reveal some very interesting results, and information in connection with the development of field corn as a grain enterprise, concludes Francis.
