More than seven thousand school children this week are counting the final days of vacation, which end, for most of them, with Labor day, Monday. One or two schools in the county have already begun, but the majority are scheduled to open Tuesday morning, and the remain-der the following week with the ex-ception of Middleton, which opens September 20.
