Albany Beats Scrappy Hilhi Eleven 14-0

Unable to cope with Albany's Unable to cope with Albany's razzle -dazzle passing attack, a scrappy Hilhi eleven lost to the Linn county squad 14 to 0 here Friday night. However, the locals displayed a vastly improved run-ning and aerial offensive and were abble to bottle up Albany's power-ful line smashes during most of the game.

A fumble punt recovered by Al-bany on the Blue and White 17-yard line put Hilhi in the hole at the start of the tilt. Immediately the locals dug in to smear the first play for a two-yard loss.
