Transportation estimates rose from \$13,850 to \$14,000, but debt

allocations fell from \$24,-800 to \$22,785. As a result of bond and warrant payments last year, the union high school district will operate this year with an indebtedness of \$99,-500, as compared to last year's bond and warrant obligations of

\$124,800—a reduction of \$25,300. The 1937-38 budget makes a provision of \$1500 for erection of an agriculture building, in accordance with the Smith-Hughes agreement. Despite this, the allocations for capital outlays remained the same.

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
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
