ORENCO—Last week Mrs. Carlyle received five letters from her daughter, Elizabeth, in Tientsin, China. They were the first word received from her since the siege of Tientsin the last of July. It was quite a thrilling experience but none of the occupants of the Isabel Fisher hospital were injured although a bomb hit the building twice and a hole was torn in the upper floor and a hole in the kindergarten building near by. She had only two American flags which were put up at corners of the church but in order to have one for the top of the hospital a large old Chinese flag was brought from the attic with the five bars of red and white and stars were added—only twenty, however. They thought the airplane occupants wouldn't stop to count the stars anyway.
