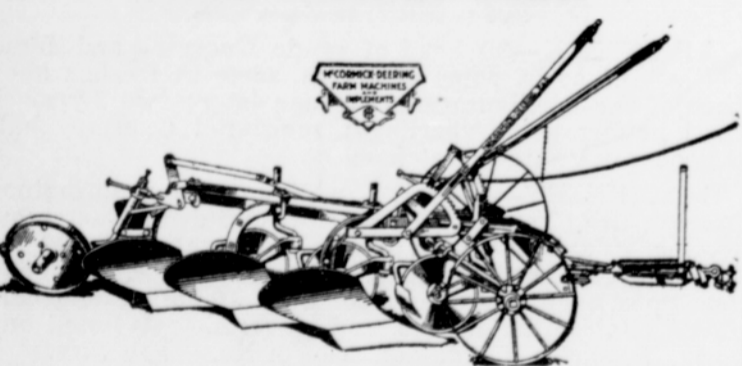
The four Hiteon hunters returned Wednesday night from Bend with one deer.
