### Personalities--

 ALOHA—With light step, the stalwart form of J. C. Gibbs moved eastward and swiftly across the kitchen floor as he attended to his bread baking and jelly making. He removed the bread from the oven, set the glasses of jelly on a window sill, settled back in an easy chair and proceeded to tell his story for the first time in his life to a newspaper reporter.

He sprung from courageous forebears in Missouri 88 years ago. His father, Benson Gibbs, was captain of the 23rd Missouri U. S. Volunteer Infantry during the Civil war when it took rare courage to take sides either way. The son at 23 rode a mule to San Francisco, back to Missouri next year, returned to Sacramento in 1875 via Omaha by railroad, which had been finished five years before.

After serving as horseherd for various stage companies with headquarters in Yreka, Canyonville, Klamath Falls, Lakeview, Paisley and Glendale, he went into the U. S. Reclamation service, where he had 14 horses to manure.

Then followed a career of ten years as deputy sheriff of Douglas county. He served under Tom Hogan, first sheriff of Douglas county, and the four succeeding sheriffs. In those early days in Southern Oregon, horse thieves, cattle rustlers and outlaws made life for law-enforcing officers with nerves of steel, such as Gibbs was blessed with, one continuous grim holiday.

A horse thief called making a successful haul Gibbs was ordered to get his man, which in those times of swift justice meant bringing him back dead or alive. By the time Gibbs reached him he had three horses in his string. In the gun battle that ensued, the thief fell with 22 buckshot in his body. He was nursed back to recovery and lodged in jail in Roseburg, where he was seemingly made for one night only. Two days before trial, two masked men gave the signal to their confederates, the other four prisoners within the jail, who unlocked the cells and doors with keys of their own make. And thus the country was rid of one more horse thief. In a gun battle with a desperate outlaw, Gibbs being a quicker and better shot, ended Mr. Outlaw's earthly troubles then and there.

He operated a lively barn and blacksmith shop in Red Lodge, Mont., for 11 years. During the World war he was government blacksmith at Fort Canby, Fort Stevens and Fort Columbia.

Since his honorable discharge in 1918 he lived two years in Portland, then moved to Huber, where he has lived in the same house on his two and a half-acre fruit and truck farm ever since.

Mr. Gibbs says that of all the states in which he has lived, Oregon is the easiest to live in. He is, perhaps, the oldest Old Fellow in Washington county, having joined Douglas Lodge No. 14, Roseburg, 63 years ago.
