

# Tigers Downed, 26 to 6, in Armistice Tilt Closing Hilhi's Local Showing

## Hilhi Gridmen Beat Tigard Armistice Day

Hilhi's gridiron warriors unleashed their big guns against Tigard on Thursday afternoon in the annual Armistice day game to roll over the Tigers 26 to 6. Despite the handicap of a slow, sloppy field, the locals turned in their best offensive showing of the year to score twice in the opening moments of play and twice more in the third period.

Tigard's highly touted aerial attack was successfully bottled up until near the end of the game. With only minutes left, the Tigers got their passes clicking against the Blue and White second string to march 54 yards for a touchdown.

**Ground Runs 52 Yards**

Hilhi had little time in driving for the opening score. Taking the opening kickoff in his own 20, Grogan, Blue and White fullback, raced upfield 52 yards to put the ball on the Tiger 28. Six plays netted 29 yards and gave Hilhi a first down on the Tigard eight-yard line. Halfback Bronleewe raced around left end for two and then Grogan fought his way through the center of the line for six more and a score. Again it was Grogan who plowed over for the extra point and Hilhi was away at 7.

Center Churchill gave Hillsboro another scoring opportunity minutes later when he intercepted Alton Young on the Tiger 28. Again Hilhi started to march. Grogan and Harold Wojahn picked up seven yards in three plays. Harry Wojahn then took a pass from Grogan for a first down on the Tigard 13.

Grogan hit right tackle for four, but on the next play Harold Wo-

john was smeared for a nine-yard loss. A third down pass was knocked down. Undaunted, Grogan faked back and passed out of a welter of Tiger linemen to Christensen, who took the leather on the goal line and fell over for another score. Tugwood dropped back out of the line to plunge for the extra point but failed by inches.

**Make Long Drive**

Tigard then made its first three of the game, taking the kickoff on the 10 and marching to the Hills 34 before losing the ball on downs. Hillsboro retaliated with a 71-yard drive that went for naught as Ketcham's fourth down pass from the Tiger 21 sailed incomplete into the end zone. As the half closed, Hilhi had the oval on Tigard's 22-yard line after a 43-yard assault.

Near the middle of the third period the Blue and White tallied their third score. Tigard was ground gradually from the kickoff and a short punt gave Hilhi the ball on the Tiger 38. Four plays gained 20 yards. Bronleewe squirmed into the open for an 18-yard dash and repeated for four more. The Harold Wojahn reversed from the three-yard stripe to catapult into pay dirt. Grogan added the extra point through the line.

**Lair Steps Out**

Lair set the stage for the final Hilhi score moments later with a 52-yard punt return to the Tiger 11. Taking the ball on his own 37, Lair started for the south sideline but was trapped, reversed his field and raced down the north sideline 52 yards before being run out of bounds.

Grogan promptly reversed around right end for nine yards. Lair followed up the final two yards and scored with a drive over right tackle as a quarter ended. Van Lom's try for point from place-kick was wide.

**Montana vs. Idaho**—Montana has too much at stake to lose this one, and apparently is the stronger team.

**Oregon State vs. Washington State**—Oregon State gets a slight edge if it isn't an impossible wet day.

**Stanford vs. California**—The Bears should win. They have a better ball team.

**Fordham vs. St. Mary's**—Fordham should win without much trouble.

**Gonzaga vs. Portland**—To be consistent I'm picking my own team.

**Williamette vs. Whitman**—The Beartcats, although Whitman is improving steadily.

**Brigham Young vs. Montana State**—Brigham Young has played fine but since its loss to Portland and should be beaten.

**Washington vs. Oregon**—Washington to win. The Huskies are now playing the kind of football they're capable of playing.

Grogan was the outstanding Blue and White performer, scoring eight

points, passing to Christensen for six more and turning in the spectacular kickoff return that put Hilhi in position for the opening score. Bronleewe turned in a sparkling showing on both offense and defense while Lair flashed to good advantage while he was in the zone. The whole first string line played hang-on ball with Churchill as the star performer. Left End Moore stood out for Tigard, proving a power on defense and turning in a nice game on offense.

Friday night Hilhi will travel to Tillamook to tangle with the Cheesemakers. Tillamook is undefeated this season and opponents have been unable to cross the Cheesemaker goal line.
