

Stump Burning Demonstration is Scheduled

A three-day demonstration of the electric blower method of stump burning has been scheduled for November 20, 21 and 22 on the Scott Mine place near Corbett.

The forced draft stump burning system has been extensively used in the Puget Sound territory to clear land of heavy stands of fir stumps.

The electric blower method of land clearing got its start through using old vacuum cleaner blowers to operate 6 to 12 inch pipes.

To reach the demonstration, go out Columbia river highway to Corbett grade school, turn south opposite school on Powder grade road.
