## Social Security Payments Ready for Eligibles

"Some wage earners who have reached the age of 65 this year and are entitled to a lump-sum of 3½% of their wages earned since January 1, of the year have failed to file claims for those benefits under the mistaken belief that they must quit work before they can get the money," advised James E. Peebles, manager of the Portland field office Bureau of Old-Age Insurance. Social Security board, recently.

"There is no requirement in the Social Security act that wage earners must quit working before they claim lump-sum payments.
