

## Changes Made in Fire Hall; Truck Arrives

Hillsboro's new fire truck—bare as yet of any fire-fighting equipment—rolled into the fire station quarters in the city hall last week amid a sort of joint christening ceremony for it and a remodeled fire hall.

The truck, a new Dodge, was delivered by Cady Motor company. It was purchased by the city for addition to the fire department's equipment. The new body and fire paraphernalia, which will make it one of the states up-to-date pieces of fire-fighting equipment, will be purchased and constructed by the firemen's organization.

**Changes Made in Building**  
Extensive alterations in the city hall recently have doubled the space of the fire department's quarters. Moved the city jail cells, added a tool and equipment storage shed, and seen the erection of a new hose drying tower. One partition was removed at the back of the old fire hall space, doubling the length of the quarters. Had it not been for this important enlargement, the new truck which has a 16-foot long chassis behind the cab, could not have been accommodated. Fire department trucks are now in the same part of the building with the city hall heating unit, thus assuring proper warmth and consequent easier starting of motors in any weather, according to S. W. Melhuish, fire chief.

Garage space on the Third street side of the city hall was cut somewhat by the alterations, and the cells of the city jail were moved to the east side of the building in the changes. Additional storage space for city trucks and equipment, however, was provided by the utilization of space formerly left idle in the west portion of the building. Tools and supplies are now housed in a new shed at the back of the hall.

**Tower Termined Economy**  
The new drying tower, a 25-foot high affair running the full height of the building, gives the fire department a long-sought accommodation for drying the 30-foot lengths of hose. Construction costs of the tower will be more than made up within a few years by the savings in hose purchases, in the opinion of Wilbur Dillon, fire marshal. It will enable the department to drain and dry hoses quickly, thus eliminating any danger of cord rotting.

Addition of the new space and quarters now assures privacy for all the city's equipment, making it possible to keep all trucks, vehicles, tools and supplies under lock and key, it was declared. Altogether, the firemen expect to pay nearly \$1000 on alterations and construction of the new truck. Building changes were carried on under a half-and-half sharing of expenses on the part of the firemen's association and the city.

Construction costs on the new truck will run somewhere between \$500 and \$600, Melhuish said. Presence of mechanics, welders and various tradesmen in the ranks of the 17 fire department members will enable the firemen to do most of the work on the truck themselves, thus saving nearly all labor costs, it was stated. By the time the truck is completed the city will have a machine which would cost in the neighborhood of \$3500, fire department officials said.

**Firemen Being Collected**  
Firemen have spent considerable time in the past two weeks visiting Vancouver, Corvallis and Yamhill and inspecting new fire equipment recently added to the fire departments in those cities, with the idea of gathering the ideas used there and incorporating them into the new Hillsboro truck.

Changes scheduled as the result of the new truck construction will see the water wagon equipment now on an old truck transferred to the White, which is being retired from fire department service.  
Nearly all the money being spent by the firemen as their share of the two projects is derived from their annual "Happy Days" event held on the Fourth of July, with some income received from their occasional dances. As the result of the heavy demands on the firemen's fund, it was stated that they may find it necessary to give another dance in the near future to maintain their sinking fund.

Harry Shelton, 2, and Herb Utery, 50, both of Hillsboro, passengers in Frank Brown's car, were all injured when their machine crashed into a truck driven by William Eichoff of Gaston. All three were employees of the Portland General Electric company here. Eichoff, together with his four-year-old daughter Jeanette, and Donald Richter, 2, were moved to a Portland hospital for treatment. Sheldon, most seriously injured, was taken to Jones hospital here, as was Utery.

Mrs. Teresa Richter, mother of the injured two-year-old boy, was just returning from a visit in a Portland hospital with her husband, who was injured recently in a similar accident near Gaston. She was uninjured.

**Car Fire Reported**  
Jack Stark of the St. Johns district in Portland was the victim of what appeared to be a hit-and-run driver Monday evening when his car was overturned east of Beaverton, according to a sheriff's office report. Stark's car was upset on the edge of the highway and caught fire almost immediately, according to reports of those viewing the wreck. Highway 100, a nearby service station and other pulled Stark from the car and removed him to Beaverton, where he was treated for head injuries and shock by Dr. C. E. Mason. Stark was in a dazed condition and unable to give any details of the accident. It was reported.

Charles W. Marshall Jr., 17, of route one Beaverton, and Albert Karpus, 13, of Beaverton, were slightly injured in a collision last Friday night on the Scholls Ferry road at Progress when Marshall's car was struck by a car driven by Arnold L. Farmer of Oswego.

A 75-year-old Tigard resident known only as "Old Jack" was injured Thursday night near the railroad crossing in Tigard when hit by a car driven by George C. Peil of Waldport. The elderly man was reported to have stepped back into the path of Peil's car to avoid being hit by a car coming from the opposite direction. His injuries were not reported, but were not thought serious.

F. J. Sewell, Hillsboro undertaker and county coroner, received leg injuries and bruises when struck Tuesday night on the street near his home by a car driven by Peter Grossen of Bethany. Sewell had just stepped out of his car when he was struck by Grossen's machine, which had swerved to the wrong side of the street in an effort to avoid hitting another car and three boys on bicycles. After striking Sewell, it side-swiped the undertaker's car and careened to the opposite curb, it was reported.

## Security Loan Demands Told by V. S. Madsen

Farmers in Washington county needing loans for livestock farm equipment, feed, seed or other operating goods must attempt to secure credit from other sources before applying to the Farm Security Administration, according to Victor S. Madsen, county rehabilitation supervisor, with headquarters in the county courthouse here.

"Ample funds are available for all bona fide farmers who meet our requirements, but the F. S. A. cannot and will not displace other government or private agencies," said Madsen. "There will always be a vital need for banks and other private credit agencies."

**Aid Handicapped is Aim**  
The purpose of farm security loans is not to compete with local banks and other credit agencies but to place handicapped farmers in a position where they will be able to obtain the local commercial credit facilities available in the community, it was explained.

Only farmers unable to qualify for sufficient commercial credit to carry on their farming operations are eligible for rehabilitation loans.

An additional service to creditors is made possible through farm debt adjustment available to all farmers in the county. Impartial negotiations between debtors and creditors often lead to payments of long outstanding obligations in the community, it was explained.

**Registration of Unemployed Set**

Registration of all unemployed workers in the Hillsboro district will be undertaken here by the state re-employment service Monday, January 3, it was revealed here this week.

A. J. Johnson, district manager of the Oregon state employment service, which is affiliated with the United States employment service, was here late last week making arrangements for the registration, and has asked for use of the city council chambers in the city hall. He plans to bring a corps of workers here on January 3 for the enrollment and will continue them here as long as it is required, adding extra workers if it is found necessary.

One purpose of the employment check here is to determine whether or not social security benefits are owed to the unemployed individuals. Their registrations will be sent to Salem and checked with federal and state records before any decisions are made on individual cases. Men on strike are not eligible to register, it was announced. Benefits paid out under the plan will run from \$6 to \$15 a week, depending upon the classification of the worker. Sixteen weeks is the maximum period over which these benefits will be paid.

Registration in Hillsboro will begin on the first day of the new year on which offices will be open. The new compensation plan become effective on January 1, two days before the close of New Year's holidays.
