

Hillsboro Leads Red Cross Contributions

While the county total is not yet available in the Red Cross roll call, the amount has reached \$2000.40 to date. Hillsboro again leads with donations amounting to \$738.18 in cash and 12 cases of Carnation milk (with a retail value of \$43.50). Of this amount many memberships are of the \$5, \$10, and \$25 value, thus leaving a larger sum here for relief work and disaster.
