"It's your function to find out how you want your power distributed, and it's my function to help you," J. D. Ross, new Bonneville dam adspecial grange-sponsored meeting in auditorium Monday night.

"The exception of today will be the rule tomorrow," he said, explaining that people should and will use more than lighting from electricity, in view of advantages of-fered by electric heating, cooking refrigeration and other services. The amount of electricity used today is only one tenth that of what will be used in the future, he declared, statloaded to capacity, the sooner rates will go down to an absolute mini-

"I have been asked 'How far can you transmit electricity?', several times," Ross stated. "The answer is —as far as you want to. You will actually send electricity to that point where you will meet other

ower at the same or lower price.
"Bonneville will eventually have to supply Oregon, but until Grand Coulee is completed five years from now it must also aid in supplying electricity to users in that terri-

His idea is to build a transmissio line from Bonneville to Coulee im-mediately, with the lines eventually to be used in a great power grid that will cover the entire west coast.

At present, Oregon, Washington and Idaho use 1,600,000 kilowatt hours of electricity each year. Past experience has demonstrated that the demand doubled every 5½ years, Ross said, and now he looks for another doubling in the next half-dozen years, with the prospect that by 1943 the three states will be using something in the neighbor-hood of 3,200,000 kilowatts. At ful production, Bonneville can turn out but 432,400 and Grand Coulee will develop 850,000, which will be in-sufficient to satisfy even the in-

crease in demand, he declared.

Price Uncertain Yet
"I wish I could tell you what the price of Bonneville electricity will be." Ross told the group, "but until the Federal Power commission de-termines the division of cost of navigation units, I will be unable to do so. It will be necessary to add
