Electric Benefits Greatly Broadened

With approximately 85 per cent of the farms in the lower Willamette valley now served by electricity, the newly-announced Electric Home & Farm Authority program for low-cost federal financing of appliances will greatly broaden the benefits of electrification.

So states R. R. Easter, Tualatin division manager of the Portland General Electric company, which is the first utility in the Pacific Northwest to make a contract with the Authority.

The plan enables customers of the Portland General Electric company to purchase major electric appliances and farm equipment from retail

dealers on down payments as low as 5 per cent with long terms. Monthly installments on appliances purchased from dealers are payable to the utility at the same time the electric service bills are due. These payments are credited to the customer's account and forwarded to the Electric Home and Farm Authority.

Families may buy under the plan, major appliances such as electric ranges, water heaters, refrigerators, washing machines, vacuum cleaners, dishwashers, waste disposals, units, radios, irons and space heaters.

Farmers may buy these appliances for their homes. And also for the first time, on the same easy terms, they may buy equipment such as electric pumps for domestic water supply, milking machines, milk coolers, cream separators, farm motors, and feed grinders.
