**Other Stories Given**

M. P. Cadore, president, is a veteran Hillsboro automobile dealer, having been here since 1917, when he came from Beaverton. For a number of years he served on the board of directors of the bank, and was chosen to fill the vice-presidency following the death of Kuratli. Prior to the merger, he had been a director of the Hillsboro Commercial Bank.

Moro, Oregon, is the birthplace and former home-town of J. L. Searcy, former Oregon State college student, who is now cashier of the Commercial National. He gained his first banking experience in Moro, starting as a bookkeeper and working up to the post of cashier. He resigned there to take a post as liquidator for the state banking department which he served for four years. He came to Hillsboro in 1933 in connection with the liquidation of the Shute Savings bank and following the completion of that work in 1935 he joined the staff of the Commercial National as cashier. Last fall he was elected a member of the board of directors. He is a member of the educational committee of the state bankers association.

B. E. Maling, member of the board of directors since 1927, came to Hillsboro in 1920 and with H. W. Ray established the Ray-Maling banking company. He is also responsible for the organization of B. E. Maling, Inc., General Foods branch, which operates the largest quick freeze plant in the United States.

Born in Washington county, Lester Ireland's interests have always been here, and he is now head of the largest hardware and furniture company in the county, in addition to operating a hop ranch on Pumpkin Ridge. He was elected to the board of directors January 1, 1937, having previously served in the same capacity for the Hillsboro National bank.

Also chosen on the board of directors immediately after the merger on January 1, 1937, was R. R. Easter, a Hillsboro resident since 1913. He is local manager of the Portland General Electric company, and holds extensive acreage in the county near Scholls. His grandparents first came to Washington county in 1865, settling near Centerville. Subsequently the family returned to Portland, and after two generations, Easter came to Hillsboro in 1913.

Newest member of the board is H. A. Kuratli, who was appointed last June to succeed his brother, the late Emil I. Kuratli. He is now a member of the real estate firm of Kuratli & Wismer, and is a native son of Washington county. He served as county clerk here for eight years.
