A scar-faced white-slaver, black-mailer and drug trafficker named Roger Millon, together with his mistress, Colette Triot, confessed after Weidmann was apprehended that they participated in some of his ventures but denied they had aided in the murders.

WEIDMANN'S first victim, so far as police investigation now shows, was attractive Jean Dekoven, a Brooklyn dancer traveling in France with her mother. The German apparently lured her to his St. Cloud villa and killed her in a rage after demanding money. After that, additional murders became a necessity and he committed them without feeling or remorse.
