Farmers Save \$75,000

Have Hots Removed from 15,000 Animals in Year

(Littleton, Colo., Independent) Farmers and stockmen owning around 15,000 horses in the state estimate they have benefited to the extent of \$75,000 on the average or a total of \$75,000 this past year by having their animals treated for the removal of bots, which annoy horses in the summer.

Farmers' estimates of benefits vary from \$3 to \$15 a horse, or a conservative average of about \$5 an animal.

After bots have been removed from the animals, they require less feed, are more vigorous, more resistant to disease and in better condition for spring and summer work. Treatment for bots also removes a lot of other parasites from the horses.
