At Jones Hospital - Albert Loomer was admitted Thursday for treatment and is convalescing.

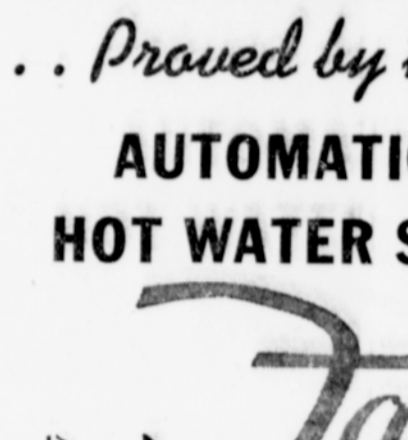
