Crow Pleads for Lumbering's Safety

total of 20 1/2 weeks—more than half the year—because of a 20-week longshoremen's strike and a four-week seamen's strike. This cutting down of working time saved deeply into workers' incomes. Citing examples, Crow said that earnings had received average annual incomes of \$2538 for the four years including the depression, but took in \$1440 annually for the past four years; millwrights slumped from \$2539 to \$1503; oilers fell from \$2163 to \$1040, and cranesmen's incomes sank from \$2069 to \$1140.

Cause of Suffering

"That's where Portland's prosperity has gone," Crow declared. "That's why relief rolls grow, why the payrolls for the city and state fall. As a result we have much suffering among the workers and their families who should have been working all the time and drawing full payrolls. In one school in a sawmill sector, 49 per cent of the children were found to be one to seven pounds underweight, with most of them sawmill workers' children. Some of them have been forced to seek clothing from charity. One grocer reported selling six quarts of milk instead of the usual 60.

All these things together cannot help but produce some spirit of resentment and rebellion in the minds of these growing children."

Blame for part of this mess can

be laid to the N. L. R. B., Crow said.

"The National Labor Relations board has been a CIO ally from the very start," Crow stormed. "It couldn't have been much worse if it had been a paid CIO organizer. Its seasons have been like a kangaroo court. One of its members here was the defeated CIO candidate for mayor in Cincinnati, Ohio."

Bridges Rapped

Intrusion of aliens Harry Bridges and Harold Pritchett into the north-west labor scene was decried. Crow declared that Pritchett was tearing down United States lumbering while boasting that of British Columbia. Quoting latest export figures, he said that Canadian mills usually produced one-fifth as much as those of Oregon, but they sold 60 per cent of exported lumber in 1932, 61 per cent in 1931, and over 80 per cent this far this year. British Columbia mills this year have already shipped 64 million feet, compared with 10 million for Washington and 14 million for Oregon. Because of labor difficulties, "the Columbia river is in such straits that no foreign boat will load lumber there if it can get a cargo elsewhere."

Sheriff John W. Connell drew praise from Crow as "one of the first in the entire United States to back up the law against the labor racketeers." He recommended arming of interest in the situation on the part of all citizens, and supporting law officers in suppressing the racketeers. Passage of resolutions by civic organizations was recommended, as well as intelligent surveys of the field of candidates in naming state and national legislators.

ability and capacity to serve the common good," he declared. "We do not have hereditary honors and positions. Each man and woman is tested on his or her own merits and advanced accordingly. Here in Oregon we have benefits of freedom—we do not submit to police inspection to travel; we do not have our homes entered and ransacked by police; we are permitted to speak freely.

Danger Emphasized

"We must preach throughout the land the benefits of our form of government—or else we are in danger of falling into the pit of the dark ages. In the complex social and economic structure we have built out of our civilization, the proper functioning of groups is essential. They should represent specialized units of people, each having a specified task or part to play in our scheme of things. Right of groups to function should be protected, provided they labor for common welfare. But at no time can any group be permitted to rise to a point of arbitrary and limitless power, for then we would be faced with dangers of dictatorship.

"Unlimited power and unrestricted activity by any group or groups for their own selfish end would bring about extinction of freedom and liberties. If powerful enough and unchecked, no group would permit anyone to run counter to its program or to thwart its schemes. Protection of the minority is one of the traditional strengths of our American systems, and it must be maintained.

To Carry On

"I have set my hand to the plow and will carry on to the end of the furrow," he promised, with reference to the labor racketeering on which peace officers recently initiated the sweeping drive that has so far netted 104 separate grand jury indictments throughout the state.

Following his regular speech, Governor Martin launched into a "fireside chat," giving intimate glimpses into current situations which were, he said, "off the record."
